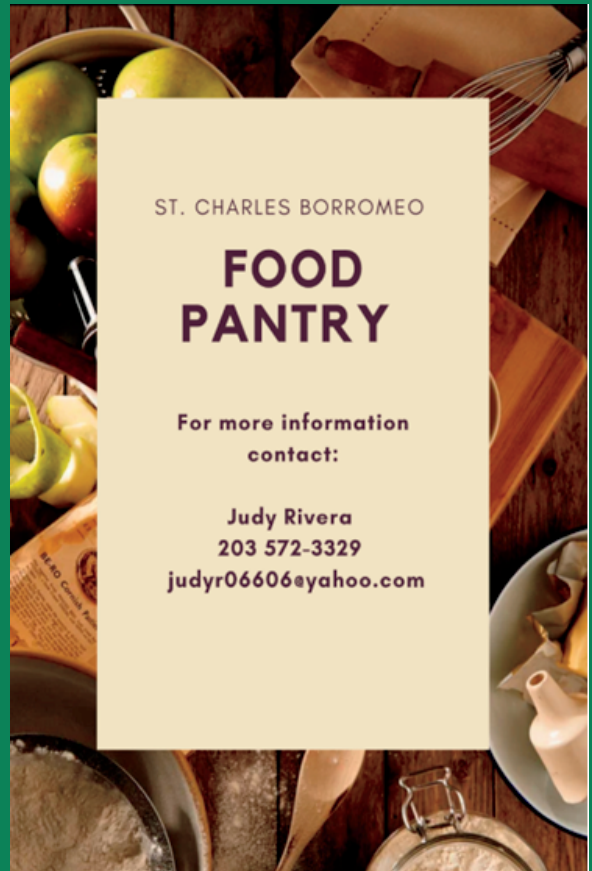

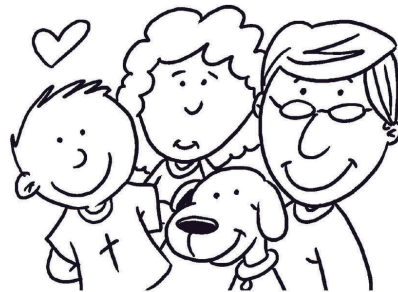

Del comentario de san Cirilo de Alejandría, obispo, sobre el libro del profeta Ageo

(Cap. 14: PG 71, 1047-1050)

➔ Dios tiene designios de paz y no de aflicción, para dar nos un porvenir y una esperanza.

ES GRANDE MI NOMBRE ENTRE LAS NACIONES

La venida de nuestro Salvador en el tiempo fue como la edificación de un templo sobremanera glorioso; este templo, si se compara con el antiguo, es tanto más excelente y preclaro cuanto el culto evangélico de Cristo aventaja al culto de la ley o cuanto la realidad sobrepasa a sus figuras. Con referencia a ello, creo que puede también afirmarse lo siguiente: El templo antiguo era uno solo, estaba edificado en un solo lugar, y sólo un pueblo podía ofrecer en él sus sacrificios. En cambio, cuando el Unigénito se hizo semejante a nosotros, como el Señor es Dios: él nos ilumina, según dice la Escritura, la tierra se llenó de templos santos y de adoradores innumerables, que veneran sin cesar al Señor del universo con sus sacrificios espirituales y sus oraciones. Esto es, según mi opinión, lo que anunció Malaquías en nombre de Dios, cuando dijo: Yo soy el Gran Rey -dice el Señor-, y mi nombre es respetado en las naciones; en todo lugar ofrecerán incienso a mi nombre, una ofrenda pura. En verdad, la gloria del nuevo templo, es decir, la Iglesia, es mucho mayor que la del antiguo. Quienes se desviven y trabajan solícitamente en su edificación obtendrán, como premio del Salvador y don del cielo, al mismo Cristo, que es la paz de todos, por quien podemos acercarnos al Padre con un mismo Espíritu; así lo declara el mismo Señor, cuando dice: En este sitio daré la paz a cuantos trabajen en la edificación de mi templo. De manera parecida, dice también Cristo en otro lugar: Mi paz os doy. Y Pablo, por su parte, explica en qué consiste esta paz que se da a los que aman, cuando dice: La paz de Dios, que sobrepasa todo juicio, custodiará vuestros corazones y vuestros pensamientos en Cristo Jesús. También oraba en este mismo sentido el sabio profeta Isaías, cuando decía: Señor, tú nos darás la paz, porque todas nuestras empresas nos las realizas tú. Enriquecidos con la paz de Cristo, fácilmente conservaremos la vida del alma y podremos encaminar nuestra voluntad a la consecución de una vida virtuosa. Por tanto, podemos decir que se promete la paz a todos los que se consagran a la edificación de este templo, ya sea que su trabajo consista en edificar la Iglesia en el oficio de catequistas de los sagrados misterios, es decir, colocados al frente de la casa de Dios como mistagogos, ya sea que se entreguen a la santificación de sus propias almas, para que resulten piedras vivas y espirituales en la construcción del templo santo, morada de Dios por el Espíritu. Todos estos esfuerzos lograrán, sin duda, su finalidad, y quienes actúen de esta forma alcanzarán sin dificultad la salvación de su alma.

From a commentary on Haggai by Saint Cyril of Alexandria, bishop
(Cap. 14: PG 71, 1047-1050)

My name is great among the nations

When our Savior came, he appeared as a divine temple, glorious beyond any comparison, far more splendid and excellent than the older temple. He exceeded the old as much as worship in Christ and the gospels exceeds the cult of the laws, as much as truth exceeds its shadows.

Furthermore, I might point out that originally there was just one temple at Jerusalem, in which one people, the Israelites, offered their sacrifices. Since the only-begotten Son became like us, and as Scripture says, though he was Lord and God, he has shone upon us, the rest of the world has been filled with places of worship. Now there are countless worshipers who honor the universal God with spiritual offerings and fragrant sacrifices. This surely, is what Malachi foretold, speaking, as if in the person of God: I am a great king, says the Lord; my name is honored among the nations, and everywhere there is offered to my name the fragrance of a pure sacrifice.

With justice, therefore, do we say that the final temple, the Church, will be more glorious. To those who are so solicitous for the Church and labor for its construction, Haggai declares that a gift will be made, a gift from heaven given by the Savior. That gift is Christ himself, the peace of all men: through him we have access in the one Spirit to the Father. The prophet goes on to say: I will give peace to this place and peace of soul to save all who lay the foundation to rebuild the temple. Christ too says somewhere: My peace I give you. Paul will teach how profitable this is for those who love: The peace of Christ, he says, which surpasses all understanding will keep your minds and hearts. Isaiah, the seer, made the same prayer: O Lord our God, give us peace, for you have given us everything. Once a man has been found worthy of Christ's peace, he can easily save his soul and guide his mind to carry out exactly the demands of virtue.

Haggai, therefore, declares that peace will be given to all who build. One builds the Church either as a teacher of the sacred mysteries, as one set over the house of God, or as one who works for his own good by setting himself forth as a living and spiritual stone in the holy temple, God's dwelling place in the Spirit. The results of these efforts will profit such men so that each will be able to gain his own salvation without difficulty.

The Convocation, which, due to Covid, had not taken place since 2017, will be held this year at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington, NY.

The theme of the Convocation is "The Road to Emmaus: Reading Scripture from the Heart of the Church." The talks for the Convocation will be given by Dr. Scott Hahn. An exceptionally popular speaker and teacher, Dr. Hahn has delivered numerous talks nationally and internationally on a wide variety of topics related to Scripture and the Catholic faith. The purpose of the three-day meeting is to strengthen the fraternal bonds among the priests and to provide a time of spiritual renewal for them so that they may return with an even greater commitment to service.
