


Saint Charles Parish Needs You and You Need Saint Charles Parish!

By registering at a parish, you are declaring your desire to be part of a Catholic faith community. If you have recently moved to the area or if you are a long-time resident, please consider registering at the parish where you participate. There's usually information in a parish bulletin or in the pew racks about how to register. When in doubt, ask a priest after Mass. In most cases, you will need to visit the parish office and fill out a simple form or register online.

Top Reasons to Register at a Parish

- A sense of belonging and identity in a parish community.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith.
- Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.
- Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so that parishes provide you timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will also receive a year-end statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address or phone number.
- Registered active members are eligible for sponsor/godparent validation.
- Registered active members are sometimes eligible to rent parish facilities.
- Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Have you ever given thought to the fact that you are an "ambassador for Christ"? An ambassador is an accredited diplomat and official representative. We are asked to be ambassadors for Christ and his message of reconciliation. Within each one of us is a prodigal son who realizes the need to return home, an elder brother who struggles with entitlement and self-pity, and a forgiving father who simply wants to celebrate love. Realizing that all of these things are operative in our hearts, we can bring credibility to God's ministry of reconciliation. Genuine witnesses are those who not only recognize their need for wholeness, mercy, and forgiveness but also their tendency to be over-self-focused and stubborn. Then, discovering freedom from all that binds them, they can then extend the love they have received to others. These ambassadors embody unity, mercy, and reconciliation and can look on others with deep compassion because they know what it is to walk in their shoes. Can God count on you to deliver this message?



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Rupert of Salzburg is also known as the "Apostle of Bavaria and Austria." Although mostly legend, it is believed that he was born sometime around 660 in Gaul, which is now part of France. It is possible that he is a descendant of the Merovingian royal line. Not much is known about the saint's early life.

We do know that Rupert was first appointed as Bishop of Worms in present-day Germany and despite many good works there, the pagan population eventually beat him and forced him from the city. Rupert retired to Rome for a time until Duke Theodo of Bavaria asked him to come to help establish the Church more firmly in Bavaria. Rupert agreed and brought with him a group of priests. Rupert traveled the region, effecting conversions, miracles, healing.

Eventually Rupert chose to settle at Juvavum an old Roman city mostly in ruins. He renamed the city Salzburg or "Salt Castle," and established there a great cathedral and monastery under the Rule of St. Benedict. His niece became abbes of the Benedictine convent he founded nearby. Rupert was the first bishop of Salzburg, serving also as abbot of the monastery.

St. Rupert is usually portrayed carrying a vessel of salt, as he helped establish the salt mining industry for which he named the city. It is said that Rupert died on Easter Sunday though sources disagree on the year, which could have been around 710 or possibly as late as 718.





From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

Throughout the next few weeks, I will be inviting you to read and reflect on different letters and homilies from various saints. It is important as Catholics that our church know the life and thoughts of the Saints, since we are called to be saints. We will find in them a lot of wisdom and knowledge, but they will also be of great consolation to us.

(Tract. 34, 8-9: CCL 36, 315-316)

CHRIST IS THE WAY TO THE LIGHT, THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE

The Lord tells us: *I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.* In these few words he gives a command and makes a promise. Let us do what he commands so that we may not blush to covet what he promises and to hear him say on the day of judgment: "I laid down certain conditions for obtaining my promises. Have you fulfilled them?" If you say: "What did you command, Lord our God?" he will tell you: "I commanded you to follow me. You asked for advice on how to enter into life. What life, if not the life about which it is written: *With you is the fountain of life?*" Let us do now what he commands. Let us follow in the footsteps of the Lord. Let us throw off the chains that prevent us from following him. Who can throw off these shackles without the aid of the one addressed in these words: *You have broken my chains?* Another psalm says of him: *The Lord frees those in chains, the Lord raises up the downcast.* Those who have been freed and raised up follow the light. The light they follow speaks to them: *I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness.* The Lord gives light to the blind. Brethren, that light shines on us now, for we have had our eyes anointed with the eye-salve of faith. His saliva was mixed with earth to anoint the man born blind. We are of Adam's stock, blind from our birth; we need him to give us light. He mixed saliva with earth, and so it was prophesied: *Truth has sprung up from the earth.* He himself has said: *I am the way, the truth, and the life.* We shall be in possession of the truth when we see face to face. This is his promise to us. Who would dare to hope for something that God in his goodness did not choose to promise or bestow? We shall see face to face. The Apostle says: *Now I know in part, now obscurely through a mirror, but then face to face.* John the apostle says in one of his letters: *Dearly beloved, we are now children of God, and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be. We know that when he is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.* This is a great promise. If you love me, follow me. "I do love you," you protest, "but how do I follow you?" If the Lord your God said to you: "I am the truth and the life," in your desire for truth, in your love for life, you would certainly ask him to show you the way to reach them. You would say to yourself: "Truth is a great reality, life is a great reality; if only it were possible for my soul to find them!"

CRISTO ES EL CAMINO HACIA LA LUZ, LA VERDAD, Y LA VIDA

El Señor dijo concisamente: Yo soy la luz del mundo: el que me sigue no camina en tinieblas, sino que tendrá la luz de la vida. Con estas palabras nos mandó una cosa y nos prometió otra. Hagamos lo que nos mandó y, de esta forma, no desearemos de manera insolente lo que nos prometió; no sea que tenga que decirnos el día del juicio: «¿Hiciste lo que mandé, para poder pedirme ahora lo que prometí?» ¿Qué es lo que mandaste, Señor, Dios nuestro?» Te dice: «Que me siguieras.» Pediste un consejo de vida. ¿De qué vida sino de aquella de la que se dijo: En ti está la fuente de la vida? Conque hágámoslo ahora, sigamos al Señor; desatemos aquellas ataduras que nos impiden seguirlo. Pero ¿quién será capaz de desatar tales nudos, si no nos ayuda aquel mismo a quien se dijo: Rompiste mis cadenas? El mismo de quien en otro salmo se afirma: El Señor libera a los cautivos, el Señor endereza a los que ya se doblan. ¿Y en pos de qué corren los liberados y los puestos en pie, sino de la luz de la que han oído: Yo soy la luz del mundo: el que me sigue no camina en tinieblas? Porque el Señor abre los ojos al ciego. Quedaremos iluminados, hermanos, si tenemos el colirio de la fe. Porque fue necesaria la saliva de Cristo mezclada con tierra para ungir al ciego de nacimiento. También nosotros hemos nacido ciegos por causa de Adán, y necesitamos que el Señor nos ilumine. Mezcló saliva con tierra; por ello está escrito: La Palabra se hizo carne y acampó entre nosotros. Mezcló saliva con tierra, pues estaba también anunciado: La verdad brota de la tierra; y él mismo había dicho: Yo soy el camino, y la verdad, y la vida. Disfrutaremos de la verdad cuando lleguemos a verlo cara a cara, pues también esto se nos promete. Porque, ¿quién se atrevería a esperar lo que Dios no se hubiese dignado dar o prometer? Lo veremos cara a cara. El Apóstol dice: Ahora vemos confusamente en un espejo; entonces veremos cara a cara. Y Juan añade en su carta: Queridos, ahora somos hijos de Dios y aún no se ha manifestado lo que seremos. Sabemos que, cuando se manifieste, seremos semejantes a él, porque lo veremos tal cual es. Ésta es una gran promesa. Si lo amas, síguelo. «Yo lo amo me dices, pero ¿por qué camino lo sigo?» Si el Señor, tu Dios, te hubiese dicho: «Yo soy la verdad y la vida», y tú deseases la verdad y anhelaras la vida, sin duda que hubieras preguntado por el camino para alcanzarlas, y te estarías diciendo: «Gran cosa es la verdad, gran cosa es la vida; ojalá mi alma tuviera la posibilidad de llegar hasta ellas.» ¿Quieres saber por dónde has de ir? Oye que el Señor dice primero: Yo soy el camino. Antes de decirte a donde, te dije por donde: Yo soy el camino. ¿Y a dónde lleva el camino? A la verdad y a la vida. Primero dijo por donde tenías que ir, y luego a donde. Yo soy el camino, y la verdad, y la vida. Permaneciendo junto al Padre, es la verdad y la vida; al vestirse de carne, se hace camino. No se te dice: «Trabaja por dar con el camino, para que llegues a la verdad y a la vida»; no se te ordena esto. Perezoso, ¡levántate! El mismo camino viene hacia ti y te despierta del sueño en que estabas dormido, si es que en verdad te despierta; levántate, pues, y anda. A lo mejor estás intentando andar y no puedes, porque te duelen los pies. Y ¿por qué te duelen los pies?; ¿acaso porque anduvieron por caminos tortuosos, bajo los impulsos de la avaricia? Pero piensa que la Palabra de Dios sanó también a los cojos. «Tengo los pies sanos dices, pero no puedo ver el camino.» Piensa que también iluminó a los ciegos.




