


Saint Charles Parish Needs You and You Need Saint Charles Parish!

By registering at a parish, you are declaring your desire to be part of a Catholic faith community. If you have recently moved to the area or if you are a long-time resident, please consider registering at the parish where you participate. There's usually information in a parish bulletin or in the pew racks about how to register. When in doubt, ask a priest after Mass. In most cases, you will need to visit the parish office and fill out a simple form or register online.

Top Reasons to Register at a Parish

- A sense of belonging and identity in a parish community.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith.
- Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.
- Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so that parishes provide you timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will also receive a year-end statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address or phone number.
- Registered active members are eligible for sponsor/godparent validation.
- Registered active members are sometimes eligible to rent parish facilities.
- Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.



LIVE THE LITURGY**Inspiration for the week**

When we encounter or even ponder God's magnificence, power, and awesomeness, we easily begin to feel our own smallness and perceived insignificance. After all, who can compete with eternal greatness, seraphim, or the ability to catch great numbers of fish? We unfortunately think that God's presence somehow overrides us, reduces our importance, and only seeks to judge our inadequacies and doubts. Things begin to change a bit when we realize that what we may have seen as overwhelming and frightening is really only unconditional, unmerited love. Love has tremendous majesty and power. When we listen to this power and stop seeing it as threatening or dooming, our fear dissipates and Divine friendship takes root. Remaining close to what we once preferred at a distance, we can journey to places we never thought possible and do things we never thought we could do. Strengthened by Divine friendship and encouraged by its life-giving power, we can say "here I am, send me!" when God asks, "whom shall I send?" Sin and fear no longer are of concern to the one who remains close to God in a bond of trust.

**SAINT OF THE WEEK**

The story of St. Josephine Bakhita (1869-1947) is a story that many people taken into slavery have experienced. Born in the Darfur region of Sudan, she was kidnapped at the age of 8 and sold into slavery many times. As she passed from owner to owner, she experienced the moral and physical humiliations associated with slavery. It was only at the age of 13 that her suffering was alleviated after she was bought for the Italian Consul in Sudan. It was here that she was fortunate to receive kindness, respect, and peace from her new master.

She was later handed over to the Canossian Sisters when she made the case that slavery had been outlawed in Italy for years. She was baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Church in 1890, where she took the name Josephine. She later entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893 and made her profession three years later.

St. Josephine Bakhita's next 50 years were spent serving people through cooking, sewing, embroidery, and housekeeping. She was a source of encouragement and her constant smile won people's hearts, as did her humility and simplicity. Today she is known as the patron saint of victims of modern slavery and human trafficking.





From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

Throughout the next few weeks, I will be inviting you to read and reflect on different letters and homilies from various saints. It is important as Catholics that our church know the life and thoughts of the Saints, since we are called to be saints. We will find in them a lot of wisdom and knowledge, but they will also be of great consolation to us.

Today I invite you to reflect on this paragraph from an explanation of Paul's letter to the Galatians by Saint Augustine, bishop

From an explanation of Paul's letter to the Galatians by Saint Augustine, bishop

(Praefatio: PL 35, 2105-2107)

LET US UNDERSTAND THE WORKINGS OF GOD'S GRACE

Paul writes to the Galatians to make them understand that by God's grace they are no longer under the law. When the Gospel was preached to them, there were some among them of Jewish origin known as circumcisers though they called themselves Christians who did not grasp the gift they had received. They still wanted to be under the burden of the law. Now God had imposed that burden on those who were slaves to sin and not on servants of justice. That is to say, God had given a just law to unjust men in order to show them their sin, not to take it away. For sin is taken away only by the gift of faith that works through love. The Galatians had already received this gift, but the circumcisers claimed that the Gospel would not save them unless they underwent circumcision and were willing to observe also the other traditional Jewish rites. The Galatians, therefore, began to question Paul's preaching of the Gospel because he did not require Gentiles to follow Jewish observances as other apostles had done. Even Peter had yielded to the scandalized protests of the circumcisers. He pretended to believe that the Gospel would not save the Gentiles unless they fulfilled the burden of the law. But Paul recalled him from such dissimulation, as is shown in this very same letter. A similar issue arises in Paul's letter to the Romans, but with an evident difference. Through his letter to them Paul was able to resolve the strife and controversy that had developed between the Jewish and Gentile converts. In the present letter Paul is writing to persons who were profoundly influenced and disturbed by the circumcisers. The Galatians had begun to believe them and to think that Paul had not preached rightly, since he had not ordered them to be circumcised. And so the Apostle begins by saying: *I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting him who called you to the glory of Christ, and turning to another gospel.* After this there comes a brief introduction to the point at issue. But remember in the very opening of the letter Paul had said that he was an apostle *not from men nor by any man*, a statement that does not appear in any other letter of his. He is making it quite clear that the circumcisers, for their part, are not from God but from men, and that his authority in preaching the Gospel must be considered equal to that of the other apostles. For he was called to be an apostle *not from men nor by any man*, but through God the Father and his Son, Jesus Christ.



Del comentario de san Agustín, obispo, sobre la carta a los Gálatas

(Prefacio: PL 35, 2105-2107)

ENTENDAMOS LA GRACIA DE DIOS

El motivo por el cual el Apóstol escribe a los gálatas es su deseo de que entiendan que la gracia de Dios hace que no estén ya sujetos a la ley. En efecto, después de haberles sido anunciada la gracia del Evangelio, no faltaron algunos, provenientes de la circuncisión, que, aunque cristianos, no habían llegado a comprender toda la gratuitud del don de Dios y querían continuar bajo el yugo de la ley; ley que el Señor Dios había impuesto a los que estaban bajo la servidumbre del pecado y no de la justicia, esto es, ley justa en sí misma que Dios había dado a unos hombres injustos, no para quitar sus pecados, sino para ponerlos de manifiesto; porque lo único que quita el pecado es el don gratuito de la fe, que actúa por el amor. Ellos pretendían que los gálatas, beneficiarios ya de este don gratuito, se sometieran al yugo de la ley, asegurándoles que de nada les serviría el Evangelio si no se circuncidaban y no observaban las demás prescripciones rituales del judaísmo. Ello fue causa de que empezaran a sospechar que el apóstol Pablo, que les había predicado el Evangelio, quizás no estaba acorde en su doctrina con los demás apóstoles, ya que éstos obligaban a los gentiles a las prácticas judaicas: El apóstol Pedro había cedido ante el escándalo de aquellos hombres, hasta llegar a la simulación, como si él pensara también que en nada aprovechaba el Evangelio a los gentiles si no cumplían los preceptos de la ley; de esta simulación le hizo volver atrás el apóstol Pablo, como explica él mismo en esta carta. La misma cuestión es tratada en la carta a los Romanos. No obstante, parece que hay alguna diferencia entre una y otra, ya que en la carta a los Romanos dirime la misma cuestión y pone fin a las diferencias que habían surgido entre los cristianos procedentes del judaísmo y los procedentes de la gentilidad; mientras que en esta carta a los Gálatas escribe a aquellos que ya estaban perturbados por la autoridad de los que procedían del judaísmo y que los obligaban a la observancia de la ley. Influenciados por ellos, empezaban a creer que la predicación del apóstol Pablo no era auténtica, porque no quería que se circuncidaran. Por esto, Pablo empieza con estas palabras: Me sorprende que tan pronto hayáis abandonado al que os llamó a la gracia de Cristo, y os hayáis pasado a otro evangelio. Con este exordio, insinúa, en breves palabras, el meollo de la cuestión. Aunque también lo hace en el mismo saludo inicial, cuando afirma de sí mismo que es enviado no de hombres, nombrado apóstol no por un hombre, afirmación que no encontramos en ninguna otra de sus cartas. Con esto demuestra suficientemente que los que induían a tales errores lo hacían no de parte de Dios, sino de parte de los hombres; y que, por lo que atañe a la autoridad de la predicación evangélica, ha de ser considerado igual que los demás apóstoles, ya que él tiene la certeza de que es apóstol no de parte de los hombres ni por mediación de hombre alguno, sino por Jesucristo y por Dios Padre.




