Saint Charles Parish Needs You and You Need Saint Charles Parish!

By registering at a parish, you are declaring your desire to be part of a Catholic faith community. If you have recently moved to the area or if you are a long-time resident, please consider registering at the parish where you participate. There's usually information in a parish bulletin or in the pew racks about how to register. When in doubt, ask a priest after Mass. In most cases, you will need to visit the parish office and fill out a simple form or register online.

Top Reasons to Register at a Parish

- A sense of belonging and identity in a parish community.
It is a commitment to practice your faith.
Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.
Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so that parishes provide you timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will also receive a year-end statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address or phone number.
Registered active members are eligible for sponsor/godparent validation.
Registered active members are sometimes eligible to rent parish facilities.
Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.

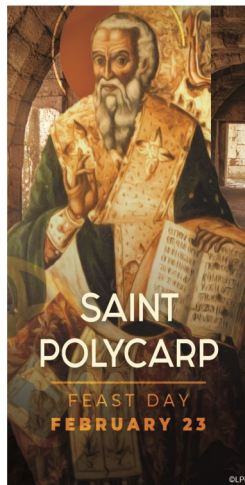

LIVE THE LITURGY
Inspiration for the week

"Love your enemies and do good to them." We have such a hard time with this teaching! But it doesn't end there. Jesus continues with turning the other cheek when struck, giving to everyone who asks, doing to others as you would have them do to you, being merciful, stopping our judgment of others, forgiving, and giving. We are okay when God does these things but get a little anxious when we realize that God really wants us to do them too! Secular justice and Gospel justice are definitely not the same. We need to remember that we are made in the image of God, not the image of ourselves. The Christian is called to act like Christ even in those situations where a more assertive or defensive response may seem more justifiable. In order to live up to this call we have to leave our resentment and need for retaliation behind, lose our defensiveness and bring into our mind and heart the realization of who we represent in this world. We are not here to satisfy or promote our own well-being and agenda. We are here for God's. That's a hard nut to crack especially when it comes to loving and forgiving people who do hurtful and violent things.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

As a disciple of St. John, the Evangelist, St. Polycarp was able to hear about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection directly from those who witnessed it. Because Polycarp was ordained as Bishop of Smyrna by St. John, he is one of three chief Apostolic Fathers, along with Clement of Rome and Ignatius of Antioch.

During his life Polycarp defended the Church against heresies. His important writing, the *Letter to the Philippians*, quoted the Gospels and Acts of the Apostles, stressing Paul's authority in the Church and setting out clear arguments against the gnostic heresy that denied Christ's divinity.

The early period of the Church was a dangerous time to be a Christian and like many, St. Polycarp was martyred. He was captured by Romans and sentenced to burn at the stake. However, the fire did not touch him, instead rising up like sails around him. Seeing that the flames would not injure Polycarp, the Romans stabbed him instead. The Martyrdom of Polycarp is perhaps the earliest fully preserved account of a Christian martyr.

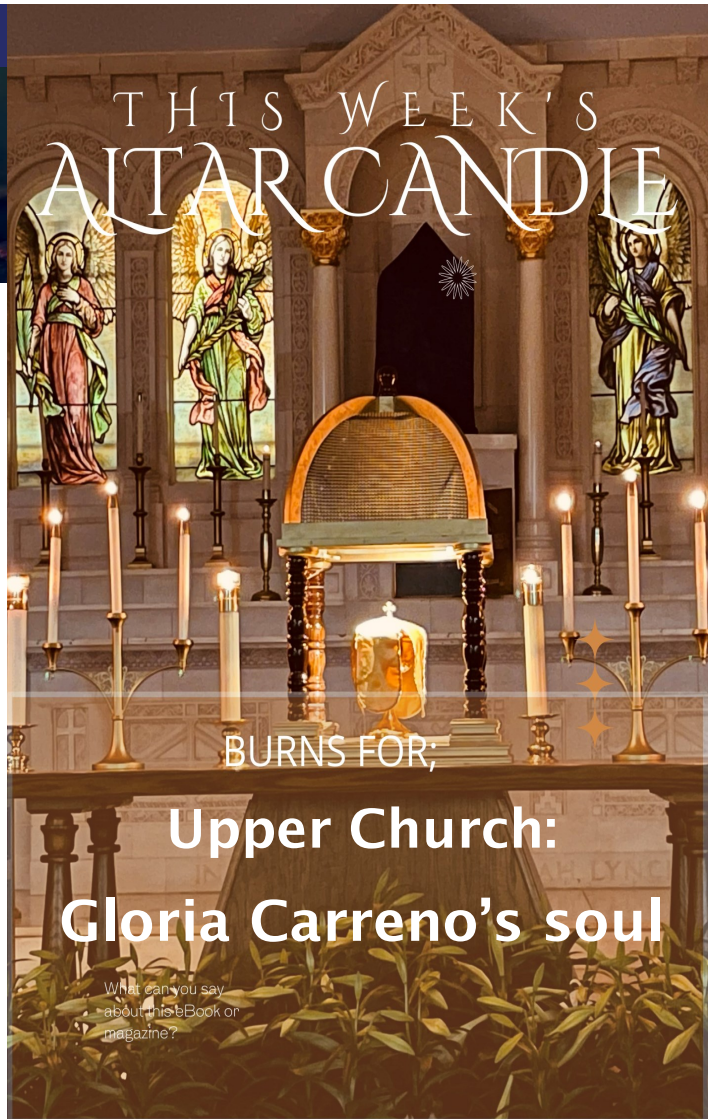

Throughout the next few weeks, I will be inviting you to read and reflect on different letters and homilies from various saints. It is important as Catholics that our church know the life and thoughts of the Saints, since we are called to be saints. We will find in them a lot of wisdom and knowledge, but they will also be of great consolation to us.

From the chapters On Charity Saint Maximus the Confessor, abbot

WITHOUT LOVE EVERYTHING IS IN VAIN

Charity is a right attitude of mind which prefers nothing to the knowledge of God. If a man possesses any strong attachment to the things of this earth, he cannot possess true charity. For anyone who really loves God prefers to know and experience God rather than his creatures. The whole set and longing of his mind is ever directed toward him. For God is far superior to all his creation, since everything which exists has been made by God and for him. And so, in deserting God, who is beyond compare, for the inferior works of creation, a man shows that he values God, the author of creation, less than creation itself. The Lord himself reminds us: *Whoever loves me will keep my commandments. And this is my commandment: that you love one another.* So the man who does not love his neighbor does not obey God's command. But one who does not obey his command cannot love God. A man is blessed if he can love all men equally. Moreover, if he truly loves God, he must love his neighbor absolutely. Such a man cannot hoard his wealth. Rather, like God himself, he generously gives from his own resources to each man according to his needs. Since he imitates God's generosity, the only distinction he draws is the person's need. He does not distinguish between a good man and a bad one, a just man and one who is unjust. Yet his own goodness of will makes him prefer the man who strives after virtue to the one who is depraved. A charitable mind is not displayed simply in giving money; it is manifested still more by personal service as well as by the communication of God's word to others. In fact, if a man's service toward his brothers is genuine and if he really renounces worldly concerns, he is freed from selfish desires. For he now shares in God's own knowledge and love. Since he does possess God's love, he does not experience weariness as he follows the Lord his God. Rather, following the prophet Jeremiah, he withstands every type of reproach and hardship without even harboring an evil thought toward any man. For Jeremiah warns us: *Do not say "We are the Lord's temple."* Neither should you say: *"Faith alone in our Lord Jesus Christ can save me."* By itself faith accomplishes nothing. For even the devils believe and shudder. No, faith must be joined to an active love of God which is expressed in good works. The charitable man is distinguished by sincere and long-suffering service to his fellow man: it also means using things aright.

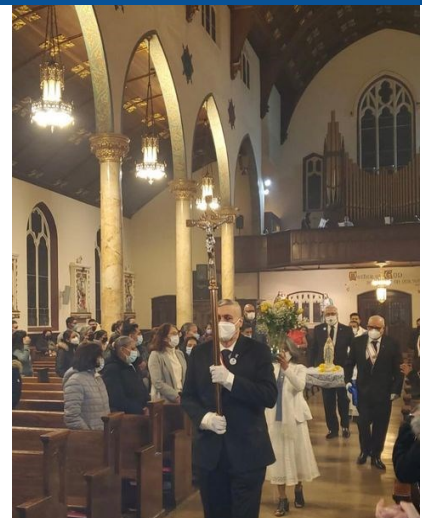

SIN LA CARIDAD, TODO ES VANIDAD DE VANIDADES

La caridad es aquella buena disposición del ánimo que nada antepone al conocimiento de Dios. Nadie que esté subyugado por las cosas terrenas podrá nunca alcanzar esta virtud del amor a Dios. El que ama a Dios antepone su conocimiento a todas las cosas por él creadas, y todo su deseo y amor tienden continuamente hacia él. Como sea que todo lo que existe ha sido creado por Dios y para Dios, y Dios es inmensamente superior a sus criaturas, el que dejando de lado a Dios, incomparablemente mejor, se adhiere a las cosas inferiores demuestra con ello que tiene en menos a Dios que a las cosas por él creadas. El que me ama dice el Señor guardará mis mandamientos. Éste es mi mandamiento: que os améis unos a otros. Por tanto, el que no ama al prójimo no guarda su mandamiento. Y el que no guarda su mandamiento no puede amar a Dios. Dichoso el hombre que es capaz de amar a todos los hombres por igual. El que ama a Dios ama también inevitablemente al prójimo; y el que tiene este amor verdadero no puede guardar para sí su dinero, sino que lo reparte según Dios a todos los necesitados. El que da limosna no hace, a imitación de Dios, discriminación alguna, en lo que atañe a las necesidades corporales, entre buenos y malos, justos e injustos, sino que reparte a todos por igual, a proporción de las necesidades de cada uno, aunque su buena voluntad le inclina a preferir a los que se esfuerzan en practicar la virtud, más bien que a los malos. La caridad no se demuestra solamente con la limosna, sino, sobre todo, con el hecho de comunicar a los demás las enseñanzas divinas y prodigarles cuidados corporales. El que, renunciando sinceramente y de corazón a las cosas de este mundo, se entrega sin fingimiento a la práctica de la caridad con el prójimo pronto se ve liberado de toda pasión y vicio, y se hace partícipe del amor y del conocimiento divinos. El que ha llegado a alcanzar en sí la caridad divina no se cansa ni decae en el seguimiento del Señor, su Dios, según dice el profeta Jeremías, sino que soporta con fortaleza de ánimo todas las fatigas, oprobios e injusticias, sin desear mal a nadie. No digáis advierte el profeta Jeremías: "Somos templo del Señor." Tú no digas tampoco: "La sola y escueta fe en nuestro Señor Jesucristo puede darme la salvación." Ello no es posible si no te esfuerzas en adquirir también la caridad para con Cristo, por medio de tus obras. Por lo que respecta a la fe sola, dice la Escritura: También los demonios creen y tiemblan. El fruto de la caridad consiste en la beneficencia sincera y de corazón para con el prójimo, en la liberalidad y la paciencia; y también en el recto uso de las cosas.

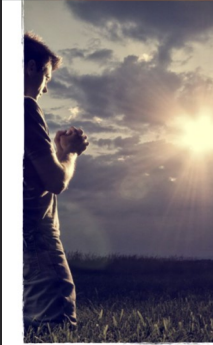
